DLA Support to CCMDs - BLUF

What DLA Provides:

- Enabling support to CCMD training events
- Active support to ~ 34 CCMD training events/year
 - Participates in planning conferences
 - Identifies Agency SMEs to support CCMD objectives


What DLA Needs:

- Use Commercial Ticket Program for DLA support
- Request DLA support in JTIMS



Expertise DLA Provides

- Provide continuous, integrated situational awareness of DLA activities
- Support decision-making and provide operational guidance during both exercise and contingency planning and execution
- Influence logistics supply chains and DLA services ISO exercises and contingency planning and execution
- Mobilize DLA resources and personnel support to exercises and contingency operations
- Provide Disposition Services/Retrograde expertise
- Key J4 staff augmentation



In Afghanistan, DLA supplies over 260 major base complexes. DLA Energy supplies a million gallons of fuel a day, while DLA Disposition Services is going to cut up and dispose of equipment there

In Iraq, DLA supports bulk commodity requirements (CL I – Subsistence, CL III – Bulk Fuel), and supports USM-I Disposition Service requirements (Scrap, DEMIL, Disposal Services)

During Ike and Gustav, DLA provided 30 million meals in 30 days. Our fuels team provided just as amazing a response

DLA - FEMA interagency agreement defines DLA as source for specific commodities, allowing both agencies to begin processing and expediting supply requests through approval chains with simple verbal notification



DLA sells to Canada, Mexico, all of Western Europe, Israel, Taiwan, Australia, Singapore, Malaysia, Indonesia and Japan -- more than 100 countries, involving nearly \$2 billion in annual sales

DLA has core competencies that can be brought to bear to provide best-value integrated supply chain management and logistics solutions

Definitions

- **Joint Contingency Acquisition Support Office (JCASO)**
 - Located within DLA J7
 - Responsible for helping coordinate DoD & Whole-of-Government (WoG) efforts to improve acquisition support
 - Currently, JCASO doesn't "do" acquisition, it just helps make it better!

- **Operational Contract Support (OCS)**
 - Process of planning for and obtaining supplies, services, & construction from commercial sources ISO joint operations along with the associated contractor management functions (i.e. CSIP & CMP development)



Why/How JCASO was Created

- Gansler Commission identified shortfalls in OCS
- Congressional Mandate : NDAA 2007, Section 854
- OASD (L&MR) via the DASD (PS) established JCASO within DLA

Mission and Organization


- Provide strategic & operational-level OCS management for OSD, including WoG matters
- O/O, provide OCS enabling capability to plan, organize, staff, control, and lead joint OCS efforts required to effectively and efficiently meet JTF Commander's objectives

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


DLA Joint Lessons Learned Overview

JLL Program Pillars of Collaboration






DLA Central Drawdown Applied Lessons Learned

DLA Disposition Services

Forward Presence

- Collaboration of DLA Disposition Services Expeditionary Disposal Remediation Teams (EDRTs) with Army Responsible Reset Task Force (R2TF) / Mobile Redistribution Teams (MRTs) and Marine equivalents
- Sorting Yards (4 sites with Marmal recently established)



DLA JLLP

Hazardous Materiel / Hazardous Waste

- Forward Environmental Process and Distribution Points
- Unit Supply Sergeant Training
- Prevent Over Procurement
- "Spent" Brass Processing

Goal = Meet Drawdown Goals and Timeline Coupled with Poor Roads and Insurgent Activity

Criteria for Processing

- Item Cost
- Size (Weight / Cube)
- Transport Cost
- Tire Pulverizing no Longer Required
- Receipt Condition (Vehicles and Equipment Stripped of HAZMAT, Explosives, and Basic Issue Items (BII))

Reutilization Restrictions

- Need Based
- 0-6 and Above for Approval
- Prevent Hording / Stock Piling
